

How to get MOC IV from QI activities you do as part of PCMH recognition

And then from there, you get to the actual attestation form. You will need the date of the NCQA recognition, the actual NCQA Certificate, personal and professional information, and you need to describe how you were involved in the QI project that was part of the PCMH recognition.

Form Instructions:

ABP Diplomates may be eligible to receive MOC Part 4 credit (40 points) for participation in National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA) Patient Centered Medical Home Recognition, 2011 and 2014.

Please note credit will be awarded only to those who attest to meaningful participation in QI projects as part of the NCQA recognition.

Key Terms:

Active Role, for MOC purposes, means the pediatrician must:

- Be intellectually engaged in planning and executing the project.
- Implement the project's interventions (the changes designed to improve care).
- Review data in keeping with the project's measurement plan.
- Collaborate actively by attending team meetings.

In order to submit the application, you will need to know the date of the NCQA recognition and upload a copy of the NCQA certificate. The form will auto save so you do not have to complete the attestation in one sitting.

[**Note:** If you participated in QI projects as part of a different PCMH certification process (not NCQA), you can apply for credit through the Small Group project Application (1-10 diplomates) or through the Quality Improvement Project Application for 10 or more diplomates.]
